ties. The NZPLERC is disposed to recommend that the State provide a financial indemnity for persons dealing in good faith with interests in land on the basis of title searches. Indemnity by negligent solicitors would be provided for but first loss would fall on the State as guarantor of the registered system.

- Restrictive Covenants. Restrictive covenants run with land. Positive covenants do not. NZPLERC is considering whether under Torrens registration, this distinction need survive or whether registration of a positive covenant against titles to land should be enforceable against subsequent registered proprieters on notice. Recent reports of the NZPLERC include:
- Charities. Minor changes proposed but a compulsory audit rejected as unnecessarily costly for rare cases of abuse.
- Farming Trusts. Legislation recommended to permit trustees carrying on a farming business to build up carrying capacity and livestock of the farm, subject to the duty of the trustees to be even handed as between competing interests.
- Company Law: Reduction of Capital. Recommendations concerning reduction in capital of companies shares in which are otherwise eligible for investment by trustees as authorised securities.
