AUSTRALIAN RIGHTS CONGRESS, SYDNEY, 16 -18 FEBRUARY 1995

The issue of covering children's rights was raised by several of the main speakers at the conference and will clearly need to be specified in any Bill of Rights. The question of an Australian Bill of Rights will receive a lot of public debate in the coming years. Conference speakers were optimistic about this as a positive process of raising community awareness of human rights issues. Children's rights will certainly be an important part of the agenda.

DCI - ASIA - PROJECT ON THE NEEDS OF GIRL CHILDREN

DCI Vice President for Asia, Ms Nelia Sancho (DCI Phillipines), has proposed that the Asia-Pacific DCI Sections work together to raise awareness of the needs of 'girl children in especially difficult circumstances' such as female street children, sexually abused and sexually exploited girls, working girls, and those affected by traditional and health practices.

DCI Sections are encouraged to lobby for international laws and special protection measures, and to monitor the implementation of existing UN standards for the protection of these children.

These issues will also be raised at the September 1995 World Conference on Women in Beijing to alert the international women's movement to these concerns.
