At a meeting chaired by Justice Richard Chisholm on 22 May, 15 enthusiastic members and friends of DCI began a new Sydney Branch. Members Barbara Stephen and Vicki Thomas gathered the meeting, opened by Justice Chisholm's short address. He emphasised three issues for success.

1 To gain support from other organisations with similar interests to work together and add more weight.

2 To set specific achievable projects and goals.

3 To achieve credibility - to identify who, as an organisation we are and to determine "What gives us the right to speak for children?" Credibility can be gained in the several ways - by research so that we can speak authoritatively, by having children as members, and by interviewing children to gain their views.

He went on to discuss the impact on children of corporations and the profit-motive, the control of media, economic rationalism and the current withdrawal of funds from human rights. He noted social research that shows that people are sad even in a family environment.

Catherine Johnson, Barrister, mediator and post-graduate student of children's rights was elected Convenor and nominated for the National Committee. Valerie Joy became treasurer, and several other members undertook other responsibilities. The Branch is planning to meet at Catherine's chambers in central Sydney, on 20 June to plan its activities.
