## THE SIXTH NATIONAL CONFERENCE

The Sixth National Conference of the Council will be held in Brisbane from 14th to 20th August, 1971. The Netherlands Government is sponsoring Prof. Buikhuisen's attendance at the Conference Dr. John Robson, a former New Zealand Minister of Justice, has been invited, also Mr. Ed Boyle, from Los Angeles. Mr. Boyle is a Salvation Army officer who has had extensive experience in half-way houses and rehabilitation programmes

The recent Executive meeting was held at the Women's College and members were pleased with the venue chosen, meals were good and the rooms comfortable - single accommodation only.

The Conference programme has been drafted and is now with the printers - registration forms will be circulated shortly together with programme details and we look forward to a good attendance of members and other interested people.

Members are requested to forward immediately to Miss Daunton-Fear, Honorary Secretary of the Council, any resolutions for submission to the Conference, or any topic (which may not need a resolution) for brief discussion on the final day of the Conference.
