

Stone reminds us that law, be it civil or international, deals with human beings. It

is not simply a body of legal rules, principles, or policies, nor can it be a decision-making process or transcendent model for world order. As long as those who promote international law keep in sight the human beings affected by such law and the rights of such individuals to minimum subsistence and security, the pursuit and implementation of international law can contribute to the order and stability longed for by nations.

Julius Stone is Distinguished Professor at the University of California Hastings College of the Law and a professor at the University of New South Wales. He is the author of thirty-two books, among which are *Human Law and Human Justice*, *Of Law and Nations*, *Legal Controls of International Conflict*, *Conflict through Consensus, and Israel and Palestine* (the last two also published by Johns Hopkins).
