Questions and Answers

With reference to Colin Fong's excellent column in the *Australian Law Librarian*, June 1993, could we suggest the following:

Re the question: Please find articles on 'no liability companies'

Using ALLI (the Australian Legal Literature Index) and using the terms 'no liability' and 'companies' (i.e. no liability + company), the following two records were retrieved:

- (1) Change of status to a no liability company, in (1992) 10 *Company and Securities Law Journal* 63-67, and
- (2) Limited liability company legislation - the Australian experience, in (1991) 1 *Australian Journal of Corporate Law* 22-54.

The term 'no liability' came up with four articles. In the additional two articles, the 'no liability' was included in the case name. All appeared to be mining cases.

Re the question: I'm looking for a recent landmark NSW case on a superannuation trust deed.

Entering 'superannuation' and 'trust deeds' (i.e. superannuation + trust deed*) in ALLI, retrieved a case note on *Lock v Westpac* in (1993) 67 *Australian Law Journal* 70-71.

Congratulations on your new format. We look forward to the next issue.
