Election of New Convenor

If there are several nominations for the position of National Convenor, an election will be conducted by postal ballot. The logistics of organising this will be settled with the State Convenors

Having a National Convenor allows our group to have a national focus and speak with one voice when needed It provides not only a focal point, but a channel for the exchange of ideas between autonomous state groups, which, in my opinion, has been of benefit to members. One ongoing challenge for the new convenor will be revisiting the question of annual conferences, which is supported by a group within the ALLG. This group will need to be encouraged to undertake a feasibility study in the next twelve monthe to test the practicality of what many agree is an excellent idea.
