Re: Access to AGIS

In the Australian Law Librarian December 1996 David Grainger, Director of SCALE, Attorney-General's Department announced that SCALE had ceased to be accessible from the departments mainframe as of December 1996 and is now available through the AGPS Server on the Internet.

AGIS however is not available on the AGPS server with the other SCALE databases.

AGIS is produced by the Lionel Murphy Library of the Attorney-General's Department and is not, and has never been, a free public access database AGIS is available online through OZLINE, KIWINET and LEXIS, all updated monthly AGIS is also available on the AUSTROM CD-ROM published 4 times a year and a newly published CD-ROM AUSTlaw, published 10 times a year

AGIS is available as a hard copy subscription item fortnightly through AGPS. The hard copy is an excellent tool for updating both CD-ROM products.
