A Simple Book Repair Manual. A useful easy-to-read set of procedures

Foreignword.com. 168 online dictionaries for 61 languages, machine translation for 19 languages, 1001 glossary links and a directory of over 1800 translators. Worth trying. Our test indicated that searches in European languages were more effective than those for Asian languages

International Child Abduction Database
Established by the Permanent Bureau of The Hague convention of 25 October 1980, *Civil*

Aspects of International Child Abduction, it provides an index to decisions relevant to the convention. The database is easy to use with a simple and advanced search as well as a keyword menu. Index entries provide a focused summary of the cases. The 'full summary' is available to subscribers.

FindSame allows you to enter either a URL or a chunk of text and retrieve a list of URLs that have similar chunks of text within their Web pages
