## Answer

The Speaker's Chair (pictured) is made from two types of wood – grey box and sassafras. It was designed by Aldo Giurgola, the architect of Parliament House, and was fabricated by David Upfield-Brown at Cuppacumbalong (Tharwa, Australian Capital Territory).

### New inquiry on conservation controls

The House of Representatives Standing Committee on Environment and Heritage has announced a new investigation into the impact of conservation controls imposed on landholders by government. The Committee will consider:

- the impact of conservation measures imposed by governments on landholders and farmers;
- international developments in ameliorating the cost of conservation for landholders;
- how to establish the private and public good components of conservation; and
- how to equitably share the costs associated with conservation among all members of the community.
