Spring has sprung at your House



With 23 hectares of gardens, Parliament House will put on a spectacular Spring show during Canberra's annual floral festival Floriade, to be held this year from 15 September to 14 October.

The Parliament House gardens incorporate a range of different landscape ideas. Many of the plants are indigenous to the area. There are also formal gardens, which are similar to traditional European gardens and include ornamental orchards, sculptures and an extensive Spring display. Altogether there are approximately 5,000 trees and 130,000 shrubs and groundcovers growing on the Parliament House site.

The displays of annuals in the courtyards and formal gardens contain 14,000 plants that are changed over twice a year.
