Legal current awareness via the internet – Keeping up to date and out of trouble!

ecent years have witnessed a steady increase in legislative activity and volume of cases before the courts. Enhancements in technological capability have presented the legal profession with a myriad of ways of accessing legal information. In 1992, an article entitled 'The information age, lawyers and negligence'1 was published in the Law Institute Journal. The opening paragraph poses the sombre question 'are lawyers failing in their duty to clients by not making use of reasonably available

information technology tools to carry out research and inquiries?'. This question became very real for the lawyers advising on the NRMA float whom the New South Wales Supreme Court found negligent partly because they failed to warn of the possible impact of a High Court judgment which had been heard, but the decision had not yet been handed down, at the time the boards voted to proceeded with the float.² In essence, they failed to anticipate and warn about a possible change in the law. The damages amounted to over \$21 million plus interest. This decision was later overturned on appeal³ but the importance of keeping up to date and using technology to your advantage is an obvious theme.

The table below outlines some *free* current awareness services available to

assist lawyers in keeping up to date with Australian legislative change and new case law developments. These services generally deliver legal updates and other legal news to your email inbox often on a daily basis. Each service offers a different type of facility and varying coverage of the different jurisdictions. Subscribing to a variety of services will give you the best current awareness updates.
