



Rosalie Shire 125th Anniversary celebrations Railway Grand Ball Response to toast

Saturday 8 May 2004, 6:30pm for 7pm Yarraman Community Hall Browne Street

The Hon P de Jersey AC, Chief Justice

It is a great pleasure to be with you to celebrate this important event, both memorable and enjoyable, and I immediately congratulate all who have been involved – a splendid effort, thank you!

My memories of <u>this</u> part of Queensland are I believe the <u>earliest</u> I recall. At the time of my birth, my parents lived at Patrick's Estate where my father ran the one-teacher school. Later we moved to Coolabunia, at a time, I should say, when there was no electricity, and only tank water – the <u>best</u> water! We also had an association with Lowood. As a young boy, I was regularly dispatched to dairy farming friends during school holidays.

As to Yarraman itself, I vividly recall the excitement of taking the "rail motor" from Brisbane to Yarraman, thence a mini-bus which was called the "service car" to Coolabunia. My mother says I was then about two years old, so the rail link we celebrate tonight had been in place for 37 years. I recall being a talkative passenger, to whom my mother patiently responded, rather to the bemusement of the other passengers, none of whom could understand a word I said – I hope that is not now said of my judgments.

So for me, Yarraman denotes the earliest memory of a happy and fulfilling life. For us all, it denotes natural beauty, community stability, lush farming, timber, a comparatively less complicated lifestyle, and those country characteristics so valued: down to earth common sense, decency and friendliness.

As we celebrate this 125th anniversary the people of Rosalie may look with great pride and satisfaction upon achievements past and present.
