A remainder which is truly vested On free or leasehold may be rested. Contingent ones can only be If following a holding free.

Contingent one must also read As *capable* (that word's the lead) Of vesting during the prior estate, Or when it ends, then on that date.

To ascertain if this will be, We are allowed to wait and see What subsequent events will show— (Unlike the other rule you know).*

Contingent ones must not cut short The prior estate—it's always taught That this must end quite naturally, And not before divested be.

If a contingent one complies
With all these rules, then realise
The rule re perpetuities
Will not apply to most of these.
