

Even though the book is directed primarily to laymen, it is thought that the Act could with advantage have been reprinted as an appendix, more especially as many sections have been paraphrased in the text. Mr. Walker would have performed a real service for the profession (both legal practitioners and patent attorneys) had he also reprinted the regulations amended up to date, but this is perhaps too much to ask.

This review could not better be terminated than by citing Dr. Johnson's words: "In this work when it shall be found that much is omitted, let it not be forgotten that much likewise is performed." The work is well printed and bound and is singularly free from proof readers' errors.
