The final version of these guidelines reflects two years of hard work on the part of previous Victorian representatives to the AYL, in particular Jason Newman.

The major event of 1998 in which AYL is involved is the aija 36th Annual Congress being held in Sydney from the 20-25 September 1998. The program set out for the Congress is extremely comprehensive and informative. The congress should be of great interest to all young lawyers and should be a lot of fun! I have taken up the position of International Young Lawyers Representative and will be assisting to promote the aija conference, in addition to promoting international work and study exchanges for Victorian Young Lawyers. Many opportunities exist through bodies such as aija, and I encourage all Victorian Young Lawyers to tap into existing networks.
