
Here the Wild Things are

Here the wild things are is a new hard cover coffee table style book that celebrates Melbourne's Wild Things: people who through boldness and uniqueness of vision are making an important contribution to the fabric of Melbourne. Each Wild Thing is featured in a spectacular double spread designed by Gollings + Pidgeon, with accompanying text written by Justine Copley and features photography by renowned photographer, John Gollings. The book provides a medium through which Melbourne can reflect on its past and contemplate the





magnificence of its future. It praises our riches and our talents, increasing our sense of possibility. It engenders community and familiarity, forging a stronger Melbourne identity. It encourages others to excel, to be bold, to be brave. It is positivity every way you look at it. It may not be destined to be a best seller, but it is going to make Melbourne *feel* good.
