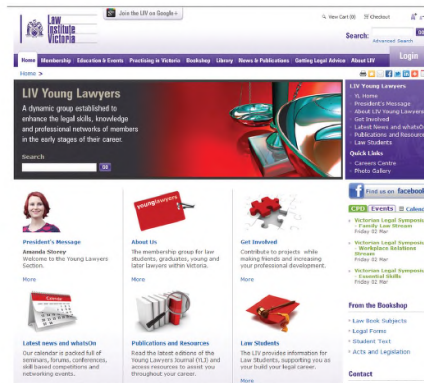


# Social media update
