# Report from A/V Committee

THE AUDIOVISUAL SERVICES Committee of the Library Association of Australia met at the University of New South Wales Library on 18 May 1982.

The Committee continues to be involved in a number of projects including the Code for Inter-Library Loans of Nonbook Materials, the National Bibliographic Control of Nonbook Materials and Copyright.

Late in 1981 the Committee prepared an extensive submission on Copyright in Nonbook Materials which was submitted to the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth of Australia by the Library Association of Australia. A paper presently being prepared by the Attorney-General's Department on Copyright in Nonbook Materials is expected to be available for comments in the near future and the Audiovisual Services Committee will be preparing a response to it.

Two major projects with which the Committee is currently involved are the Development of Guidelines for Publishers on the Packaging of Nonbook Materials and the Preparation of Guidelines for the Development and Use of Collections of Video Recordings in Public Libraries. A Working Party, chaired by Mr. Stephen Doyle (a member of the Committee), has been established and comments on this matter would be welcomed, and should be sent direct to Mr Doyle.
