## Review of Library Technicians Section (National Group)

### Call for Submissions

The increasing importance of a national presence for the Library Technicians Section is beyond dispute, and accordingly the National Group is to review its structure and constitution. The Review will:

- identify and assess the principle roles of the National Group;

The review will involve literature searches, interviews and submissions, leading to conclusions and recommendations. A report will be distributed to relevant bodies within ALIA.
