Victoria's virtual libraries

Two million visitors, and counting...

Victoria's Virtual Library, a gateway to the State's public libraries, has recently recorded its first two million hits. Victoria's Virtual Library enables members of the public and students to access current issues, online databases, catalogues and full-text magazines.

Administered through the State Library of Victoria's VICNET division, the Virtual Library is part of Multimedia Victoria's Connecting Communities strategy. The Minister for State and Regional Development, John Brumby, launched the Victoria's Virtual Library in May 2000 as part of Libraries Online program.

The public can use the 'Hot Topics' icon to link to web pages or sites focusing on current issues. 'Hot Topics' also links to a site covering issues of regional significance, such as the Scoresby Bypass and marine parks. Local Victorian public library staff contribute to these links to keep them updated and relevant.

Other services include 'The Open Road' site, which assists non-English speaking communities to link to sites in their own language, and an e-mail reference service.
