FOR

An Act to alter the Constitution so as to enable a person holding an office of profit under the Crown to be chosen as a senator or as a member of the House of Representatives

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen, and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the approval of the electors, as required by the Constitution, as follows:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Constitution Alteration (Holders of Offices of Profit) 1981.

Disqualification

- 2. The Constitution is altered by adding at the end of section 44 the following paragraph:
- "Sub-section (iv.) shall not prevent a person who holds an office of profit under the Crown from being chosen as a senator or as a member of the House of Representatives but a person who holds such an office shall be incapable of sitting or of receiving any allowance as a senator or as a member of the House of Representatives.".
