FOR

An Act to amend the *Crimes Act 1914* to provide for the protection of certain Australian Flags

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen, and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:

Short title etc.

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Crimes (Protection of Australian Flags) Act 1989.
 - (2) In this Act, "Principal Act" means the Crimes Act 19141.

Commencement

- 2. This Act commences on the day on which it receives the Royal Assent.
 - 3. After section 28 of the Principal Act the following section is inserted:

Desecrating etc. the Australian National Flag and Australian Ensigns

- "28A. (1) A person who:
- (a) desecrates or otherwise dishonours the Australian National Flag or an Australian Ensign; or

(b) without lawful authority, burns, mutilates or otherwise destroys the Australian National Flag or an Australian Ensign;

shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: \$5,000 or imprisonment for 2 years, or both.

- "(2) In subsection (1):
- 'Australian Ensign' means:
 - (a) the Australian White Ensign;
 - (b) the Australian Red Ensign; or
 - (c) the Royal Australian Air Force Ensign.".
