A BILL

FOR

An Act to amend the <u>National Health Act 1953</u> to revoke a determination of the <u>Pharmaceutical Benefits</u> Remuneration Tribunal, and for related purposes

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen, and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:

Short title

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the <u>National Health</u> (Pharmaceutical Benefits Determination Revocation) Amendment Act 1989.
- (2) The National Health Act 1953 is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

National Health (Pharmaceutical Benefits Determination Revocation and Tribunal Membership) Amendment No. , 1989

Commencement

- 2. (1) Subject to subsection (2), this Act commences on the day on which it receives the Royal Assent.
- (2) If this Act receives the Royal Assent on a day after 30 September 1989, it shall be deemed to have commenced on 30 September 1989.

Disallowance of PBRT decision

3. The determination of the Pharmaceutical Benefits Remuneration Tribunal dated 28 August 1989 and made under section 98B of the Principal Act is and shall be of no force or effect.
