BE IT ENACTED by the Queen, and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:

Short title, &c.

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the States Grants (Tertiary Education Assistance) Amendment Act 1986.
- (2) The States Grants (Tertiary Education Assistance) Act 1984¹ is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Commencement

2. This Act shall come into operation on the day on which it receives the Royal Assent.

Promotion of equality of opportunity

- 3. Section 7 of the Principal Act is amended—
- (a) by omitting from paragraph (5) (b) "\$1,140,000" and substituting "\$1,155,000"; and
- (b) by omitting from paragraph (5) (c) "\$1,140,000" and substituting "\$1,150,000".

Repeal and substitution of Schedules

10. Schedules 1 to 23 (inclusive) to the Principal Act are repealed and the Schedules set out in the Schedule to this Act are substituted.
