OUTLINE

Edible Oils (Export Inspection Charge) Amendment Bill 1983

The purpose of this Bill is to increase the maximum rate of levy which may be prescribed for recoupment of the costs of export edible oil inspection services provided by the Commonwealth. The principal Act, the Edible Oils (Export Inspection Charge) Act 1982, had the purpose of introducing charges for Commonwealth inspection of edible oils for export. The rates of charge are prescribed subject to a maximum of \$2.00 per tonne. The new maximum proposed is \$6.60 per tonne.
