“Meteorological Telegrams transmitted to or from Commonwealth meteorological offices or stations—Free.”

APPROPRIATION (WORKS AND BUILDINGS) 1924-25.

An Act to grant and apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five for the purposes of Additions, New Works, Buildings, &c., and to appropriate such sum.

[Assented to 15th August, 1924.]

Preamble.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows :—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation (Works and Buildings) Act 1924-25*.

Issue and application of £403,789.

2. The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five the sum of Four hundred and three thousand seven hundred and eighty-nine pounds.

Appropriation.

3. The said sum granted by this Act is appropriated for the purposes and services set forth in the Schedule in relation to the financial year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.

CATTLE EXPORT BOUNTY.

No. 14 of 1924.

An Act to provide for the Payment of a Bounty on
the Export of Live Cattle.

[Assented to 15th August, 1924.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, Preamble.
and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of
Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the
House of Representatives, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Cattle Export Bounty Act* 1924. Short title.

2. In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears— Definition.
“ the Department ” means the Department of Trade and Customs.

3. There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, Appropriation
which is hereby appropriated accordingly, the bounty specified in this for payment
Act. of bounty.

4. The bounty under this Act shall be at the rate of Ten shillings Specification
per head payable in respect of the export from the Commonwealth, of bounty.
