shall be laid before both Houses of the Parliament by the Minister within thirty days after the expiration of the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirtytwo, if the Parliament is then sitting and, if not, then within thirty days after the next meeting of the Parliament.

11. The Governor-General may make regulations, not inconsistent Regulations. with this Act, prescribing all matters which by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed, for carrying out or giving effect to this Act, and in particular for prescribing penalties not exceeding Fifty pounds or imprisonment for a period not exceeding three months for any breach of the regulations.

APPROPRIATION (UNEMPLOYMENT RELIEF WORKS).

No. 49 of 1931.

An Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a sum of Two hundred and fifty thousand pounds for the purpose of Expenditure on Works to provide Relief to Persons out of Employment.

[Assented to 4th November, 1931.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Preamble. Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:-

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation (Unemployment short title. Relief Works) Act 1931.
- 2. There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Appropriation Fund, which is hereby appropriated accordingly, for the purpose of unemployment expenditure on prescribed works to provide relief to persons out relief works. of employment, the sum of Two hundred and fifty thousand pounds.

3. The Governor-General may make regulations, not inconsistent Regulations. with this Act, prescribing all matters which are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed, for carrying out or giving effect to this Act, and in particular for prescribing the works on which moneys may be expended in pursuance of this Act.
