ARBITRATION (PUBLIC SERVICE).

No. 1 of 1928.

An Act to amend the Arbitration (Public Service)

Act 1920.

[Assented to 14th March, 1928.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the Arbitration (Public Service) Short title and citation

- (2.) The Arbitration (Public Service) Act 1920* is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- (3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Arbitration (Public Service) Act 1920-1928.

Tenure of Arbitrator.

- 2. Section six of the Principal Act is amended by inserting at the end of sub-section (2.) the following provise:—
- "Provided that if the person who is appointed Public Service Arbitrator is, at the time of his appointment, more than fifty-eight years of age, the term of his appointment shall be the period which will expire upon his attaining the age of sixty-five years.".

CUSTOMS TARIFF.

No. 2 of 1928.

An Act relating to Duties of Customs.

[Assented to 31st March, 1928.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the Customs Tariff 1928.
- (2.) The Customs Tariff 1921-1926*, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Customs Tariff 1921-1928.

Amendment of Tariff.

2. The Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1921-1926 is amended as set out in the Schedule to this Act, and duties of Customs are hereby imposed in accordance with the first-mentioned Schedule as amended by the last-mentioned Schedule.

Date from which new duties commence. 3.—(1.) Subject to sub-section (2.) of this section, the duties imposed by the Schedule to this Act shall be deemed to have been imposed ac from the twenty-fifth day of November One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven at nine o'clock in the forenoon, reckoned according to standard time in the Territory for the Seat of Government.
