No. 6 of 1941.

An Act to amend section twenty-nine B of the *Crimes Act 1914-1937.*

[Assented to 4th April, 1941.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :—

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Crimes Act 1941.*

Short title
and citation.

(2.) The *Crimes Act 1914-1937**, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Crimes Act 1914-1941.*

2. This Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the third day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine.

Commencement.

3. Section twenty-nine B of the *Crimes Act 1914-1937* is amended by omitting the words "either verbally or in writing" and inserting in their stead the words "in any manner whatsoever".

No. 7 of 1941.

An Act to amend the *Acts Interpretation Act* 1901-1937.

[Assented to 4th April, 1941.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :—

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Acts Interpretation Act 1941.*

Short title
and citation.

(2.) The *Acts Interpretation Act 1901-1937** is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Acts Interpretation Act 1901-1941.*
