- 2. This Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the commencement. third day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine.
- 3. Section twenty-nine B of the Crimes Act 1914-1937 is amended False by omitting the words "either verbally or in writing" and inserting in their stead the words "in any manner whatsoever".
