COMMONWEALTH AID ROADS.

No. 43 of 1955.

An Act to amend the Commonwealth Aid Roads Act 1954.

[Assented to 2nd November, 1955.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the Commonwealth Aid Roads Act 1955.
- (2.) The Commonwealth Aid Roads Act 1954* is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- (3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Commonwealth Aid Roads Act 1954-1955.

- 2. This Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the commencement. date of commencement of the Principal Act.
- 3. Section nine of the Principal Act is amended by omitting Grants to States for sub-section (1.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-section:-

works on rural and other roads.

- "(1.) There are payable to the States, out of the Trust Account, in respect of each year during the period of five years that commenced on the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four, for the purpose of financial assistance, the amounts paid into the Trust Account in respect of that year, less—
 - (a) in the case of the year that commenced on the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four—the sum of Nine hundred thousand pounds; and
 - (b) in the case of each other year—the sum of Nine hundred and fifty thousand pounds.".
- 4. Section thirteen of the Principal Act is amended by omitting Road safety sub-section (1.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-section:—

- "(1.) There is payable out of the Trust Account—
- (a) in respect of the year that commenced on the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four—the sum of One hundred thousand pounds; and
- (b) in respect of each year during the period of four years immediately following that year—the sum of One hundred and fifty thousand pounds,

which may be expended by the Commonwealth, as approved by the Minister, on the promotion of road safety practices throughout Australia.".
