

## CHIEF JUSTICE'S PENSION.

### No. 38 of 1918.

An Act to provide for the Grant of a Pension to the  
First Chief Justice of Australia.

[Assented to 25th December, 1918.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, Preamble.  
and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of  
Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in  
the House of Representatives, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Chief Justice's Pension Act* Short title.  
1918.

2.—(1.) The First Chief Justice of Australia shall be entitled upon Pension for  
First Chief  
Justice of  
Australia.  
resigning his office to demand a pension, by way of annuity, to be  
continued during his life, to the amount provided by sub-section (2.)  
of this section.

(2.) The amount of the pension shall be the amount of pension  
which the Chief Justice would have been entitled, under the laws  
of the State of Queensland, to demand if he had continued to  
occupy the office of Chief Justice of Queensland during the period  
during which he has occupied the office of Chief Justice of  
Australia.

3. The pension payable in pursuance of this Act shall be Appropriation  
for payment  
of pension.  
charged on and paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, which  
is hereby appropriated accordingly.
