2. The Schedule to the Principal Act is amended as set out in the Schedule to this Act, and Duties of Customs are hereby imposed in accordance with the first-mentioned Schedule, as amended by the last-mentioned Schedule.

Date from which new duties commence.

3. The duties imposed by the Schedule to this Act shall be deemed to have been imposed as from the twenty-second day of November, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine at nine o'clock in the forenoon, reckoned according to the standard time in the Territory for the Seat of Government.

# CUSTOMS TARIFF VALIDATION.

## No. 4 of 1930.

An Act to provide for the Validation of the Collection of certain Duties of Customs.

[Assented to 29th March, 1930.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the Customs Tariff Validation Act 1930.

2. All Duties of Customs which have been, or which purport to Validation of have been, collected, on or after the eighth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and one, and on or before the twenty-first day Customs. day of November, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, in pursuance of any of the Tariff sub-items specified in the Schedule to this Act, or, where a paragraph of a sub-item is specified, in pursuance of that paragraph, shall be deemed to have been lawfully collected.

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Solar Observatory Fund Act 1930. Short use.
- 2. In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears—

Definitions

- "the Director" means the Director of the Observatory and, where there is a vacancy in the office of Director, includes the officer for the time being in charge of the Observatory;
- "the Fund" means the Fund established under this Act;
- "the Observatory" means the Solar Observatory in the Territory for the Seat of Government:
- "the trustees" means the trustees appointed by or under this Act.
