

## CUSTOMS TARIFF (NEW ZEALAND PREFERENCE) VALIDATION (No. 2).

### No. 46 of 1941.

An Act to provide for the Validation of Collections of Duties of Customs under Customs Tariff (New Zealand Preference) Proposals.

[Assented to 25th November, 1941.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :—

Short title .

1. This Act may be cited as the *Customs Tariff (New Zealand Preference) Validation Act (No. 2)* 1941.

Commencement.

2. This Act shall come into operation on the day on which it receives the Royal Assent.

Validation of collections under Customs Tariff (New Zealand Preference) Proposals.

3. All duties of Customs demanded or collected (whether before or after the commencement of this Act and on or before the thirty-first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two) pursuant to the Customs Tariff (New Zealand Preference) Proposals introduced into the House of Representatives on the second day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one, and the twenty-ninth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one, shall be deemed to have been lawfully imposed and lawfully demanded or collected.

## EXCISE TARIFF VALIDATION.

### No. 47 of 1941.

An Act to provide for the Validation of Collections of Duties of Excise under Excise Tariff Proposals.

[Assented to 25th November, 1941.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the *Excise Tariff Validation Act* 1941.

2. This Act shall come into operation on the day on which it receives the Royal Assent. Commencement.

3. All duties of Excise demanded or collected (whether before or after the commencement of this Act and on or before the thirty-first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two) pursuant to the Excise Tariff Proposals introduced into the House of Representatives on the twenty-first day of November, One thousand nine hundred and forty, the eleventh day of December, One thousand nine hundred and forty, the second day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one, and the twenty-ninth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one, shall be deemed to have been lawfully imposed and lawfully demanded or collected. ## INVALID AND OLD-AGE PENSIONS.

### No. 48 of 1941.

An Act to amend the *Invalid and Old-age Pensions Act 1908-1940*, and for other purposes.

[Assented to 25th November, 1941.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :—

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Invalid and Old-age Pensions Act 1941*. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Invalid and Old-age Pensions Act 1908-1940\** is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Invalid and Old-age Pensions Act 1908-1941*.

2. This Act shall come into operation on the eleventh day of December, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one. Commencement.

3. Section four of the Principal Act is amended by adding at the end thereof the following sub-section :— Definitions.

“(2.) For the purposes of this Act a person shall be deemed to be permanently incapacitated for work if he is permanently incapable of work or if the degree of his capacity for work does not exceed Fifteen per centum.”.
