WAR PENSIONS APPROPRIATION.

An Act to grant and apply out ot the Consolidated Revenue Fund sum for а War Pensions.

[Assented to 30th June, 1949.] BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows :---

1. This Act may be cited as the War Pensions Appropriation short title. Act 1949.

POST AND TELEGRAPH RATES. No. 23 of 1949.

An Act to amend the Post and Telegraph Rates Act 1902-1941.

[Assented to 30th June, 1949.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :----

1.-(1.) This Act may be cited as the Post and Telegraph Rates short title Act 1949.

(2.) The Post and Telegraph Rates Act 1902–1941* is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Post and Telegraph Rates Act 1902–1949.

2. This Act shall come into operation on the first day of July, commencement. One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine.

3. Section six \mathbf{A} of the Principal Act is repealed.

4. Section eight of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section inserted in its stead :---

"8. All Braille and Moon postal articles, and such other postal Braille and articles for the use of the blind as are prescribed, shall, if posted as articles free. prescribed, be conveyed without charge.".
