

BANKS AND BANK HOLIDAYS  
(AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 10, 1925.

An Act to provide that when Anzac Day falls on a Sunday the next following Monday shall be a bank holiday; for this purpose to amend the Banks and Bank Holidays Act, 1912; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 2nd December, 1925.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

**1.** This Act may be cited as the "Banks and Bank Holidays (Amendment) Act, 1925." Short title.

**2.** The Banks and Bank Holidays Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, is amended by inserting in Part I of the Fourth Schedule, immediately before the words "or Christmas Day," the words "or the twenty-fifth day of April (Anzac Day)." Amendment of Act No. 43, 1912. Fourth Schedule.
