An Act for authorizing all Fines Penalties and Forfeitures to be levied and paid in Sterling Money of the Realm. [10th February, 1832.]

CURBENCY.

HEREAS by sundry Acts of Council and Ordinances now in force Preamble. it is enacted ordered and directed that certain fines penalties and forfeitures shall be paid in Spanish Dollars And whereas it is expedient for promoting the circulation of Sterling Money of the Realm of Great Britain in furtherance of the instructions of His Majesty's Government for establishing an uniform currency in the whole of His Majesty's Foreign Possessions that all such fines penalties and forfeitures shall in future be paid in Sterling Money Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales by and with the advice of the Legislative Council That from and after the passing and Fines to be paid in publication of this Act for each and every Spanish Dollar ordered to be Sterling Money. levied or paid for any fine penalty or forfeiture under any Law or Ordinance of this Colony there shall be paid the sum of Four Shillings and Four-pence of Sterling Money of the Realm of Great Britain and in the same proportion for any fractional parts of the said Spanish Dollar so enacted ordered and directed to be levied or paid.
