

CRIMES (AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 3, 1954.

Elizabeth II, No. 13, 1954. An Act to declare the law with respect to the inadmissibility of confessions, admissions, and statements induced by untrue representations; for this purpose to amend section four hundred and ten of the Crimes Act, 1900, as amended by subsequent Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 14th April, 1954.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Crimes (Amendment) Act, 1954."

Amendment of Act No. 40, 1900, s. 410. (Confessions, etc., when inadmissible.) **2.** The Crimes Act, 1900, as amended by subsequent Acts, is amended by inserting in paragraph (a) of subsection one of section four hundred and ten after the word "him" the words "by the prosecutor, or some person in authority".
