City Bank Act Extension—Victorian Coal-mining Company's (No. 2).

CITY BANK ACT EXTENSION. An Act to continue for a further term of twenty-one years the provisions of the "City Bank Act" whereby the City Bank as thereby incorporated was empowered to make issue circulate and reissue Bank Notes or Bills. [19th August, 1884.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS by the terms of the seventh section of the "City Bank Act" the provisions therein contained for empowering the City Bank to make issue circulate and reissue bank notes or bills in manner therein provided were thereby limited to a term of twenty-one years to commence as therein mentioned. And whereas the said term of twenty-one years will shortly expire and it is expedient to continue the said provisions for a further period of twenty-one years. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

City Bank Act extended.

1. The powers conferred upon the City Bank by the seventh section of the "City Bank Act" shall subject to the provisions in the said Act contained be and are hereby extended and shall continue and remain in force for a further term of twenty-one years from the passing of this Act.

Short title.

2. This Act may be cited as the "City Bank Act Extension Act of 1884."
