An Act to indemnify the Collector and Officers CUSTOMS INDEMNITY.
of Customs in respect of the remission of
certain Customs Duties payable at Albury.
[24th July, 1854.]

WHEREAS a Custom House has lately been established at Albury Preamble.
on the northern side of the River Murray And whereas
previously to such establishment certain persons in Albury and other
places adjacent thereto and situate within the Colony of New South
Wales had given directions for the purchase and transmission to them
from Melbourne in the Colony of Victoria of various dutiable goods
And whereas such goods were procured and transmitted accordingly
such goods having paid at Melbourne the duties of Customs chargeable
thereon by the laws of the said Colony of Victoria And whereas the
Collector of Customs for the Colony of New South Wales has with
the sanction of the Governor and Executive Council thereof allowed
the said goods to be admitted at Albury aforesaid without payment of
the duties of Customs chargeable thereon upon such admission And
whereas under the special circumstances of the case it is expedient
that the said Collector of Customs and all Officers concerned in the
admission of the said goods without payment of duty thereon within
this Colony as aforesaid should be indemnified in respect thereof Be
it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South
Wales by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof That the said Collector of Customs and all Officers concerned Indemnity granted.
in admission of the said goods without payment of duty thereon as
aforesaid shall be and they are hereby indemnified and held harmless
in respect of such non-payment of duty as aforesaid.
