

CANTERBURY ROAD BRIDGE RE-CONSTRUCTION ACT.

Act No. 1, 1949.

An Act to sanction and to provide for the re-
construction of the bridge over the Cooks
River at Canterbury; and for purposes
connected therewith. [Assented to, 12th
April, 1949.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty,
by and with the advice and consent of the Legis-
lative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South
Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of
the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Canterbury Road
Bridge Re-construction Act, 1949." **Short title.**

2. (1) (a) The carrying out of the work described in
the Schedule to this Act is hereby sanctioned. **Works
sanctioned.**

(b) The said work shall be deemed to be an
authorised work within the meaning of the Public Works
Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts.

(c) The Minister for Public Works is
empowered to carry out the said work and shall be the
constructing authority for the same within the meaning
of the said Act, as so amended, and shall enter into such
contracts and take all such necessary steps for the proper
execution thereof as such authority may think proper.

(d) The provisions of the Public Works Act,
1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, sections thirty-four,
thirty-five, thirty-six and thirty-seven excepted, shall
apply to and in respect of the said work.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of subsection one of this section the provisions of section thirty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, shall apply to and in respect of any contracts referred to in paragraph (c) of subsection one of this section.

Plan. 3. The plan of the said work is the plan marked "Canterbury Road Bridge Re-construction" signed by the Minister for Public Works and countersigned by the Chief Engineer, Department of Public Works, and deposited in the public office of the said Minister.

Estimated cost. 4. The cost of carrying out the said work (exclusive of land resumptions) is estimated at forty-two thousand pounds, and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum.

Part XIIA of Local Government Act, 1919, not to apply. 5. The provisions of this Act shall have effect and any land acquired for the purposes of the said work may be used for or in connection with the re-construction and use of a bridge over the Cooks River at Canterbury notwithstanding anything contained in Part XIIA of the Local Government Act, 1919, as amended by subsequent Acts.

SCHEDULE.

The re-construction of a bridge over the Cooks River at Canterbury comprising:—

- (1) a bridge of the reinforced concrete slab and girder type with five spans supported on reinforced concrete piers;
- (2) other ancillary works as deemed necessary or desirable by the constructing authority.

The whole of the works hereinbefore described to be subject to such modifications as may be deemed necessary or desirable by the constructing authority.
