An Act to apply certain Sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales, towards the Services of the Year 1888. [24th March, 1888.]

Consolidated REVENUE FUND (No. 3).

WHEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects Preamble. the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have resolved to grant to Your Majesty the sum of One million and forty-three thousand and thirty-three pounds, that is to say—

The sum of Four hundred and ninety-three thousand pounds, being the sum required to defray the expenses of the various Departments and Services of the Colony for the month of March or following month of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight. And

The sum of Five hundred and fifty thousand and thirty-three pounds for the Services set forth in the Schedule hereto

And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales the sum so granted to Her Majesty. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales £1,043,033 may be there shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good consolidated the supply so resolved to be granted to Her Majesty for the said Revenue Fund. several Services, the sum of One million and forty-three thousand and thirty-three pounds, of which the sum of Four hundred and ninetythree thousand pounds is to be expended at the rates which have been sanctioned for the year one thousand eight hundred and eightyseven, subject to the rate of any reduction that may hereafter be made in the expenditure of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and Five hundred and fifty thousand and thirty-three pounds for the Services specified in the Schedule hereto annexed.

2. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said sum for the Treasurer to pay Services aforesaid in such manner and in such proportions as the Warrant or Order. Governor, by Warrants or Orders in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct. And the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony.

3. The Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be Treasurer to have allowed credit for all sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such credit and receipts to discharge him. Warrants or Orders. And the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be full and valid discharges to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for such sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.
