## Act No. 3, 1901.

Consolidated Revenue Fund (No. 2). An Act to apply certain sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales towards the Services of the Year 1901–1902. [27th September, 1901.]

Preamble

WHEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have resolved to grant to Your Majesty the sum of One million one hundred thousand pounds, that is to say—

The sum of One million and seventy-five thousand pounds, being the sum required to defray the expenses of the various Departments and Services of the State during the months September and October, or following month of the financial year ending thirtieth June, one thousand nine hundred and two. And

The sum of Twenty-five thousand pounds for the Services set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed:

And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales the sum so granted to His Majesty: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with

with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales £1,100,000 may be there shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good issued out of the Consolidated the supply so resolved to be granted to His Majesty for the said several Revenue Fund. Services, the sum of One million one hundred thousand pounds, of which the sum of One million and seventy-five thousand pounds is to be expended at the rates which are shown on Estimates for the financial year ending thirtieth June, one thousand nine hundred and two, as laid on the Table of the House, subject to the rate of any reduction that may hereafter be made in the expenditure of the year 1901–1902, and Twenty-five thousand pounds for the Services specified in the Schedule hereto annexed.

2. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said sum for the Treasurer to pay Services aforesaid in such manner and in such proportions as the warrant or Order. Governor, by Warrants or Orders in writing under his hand, and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct. And the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the State.

3. The Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be Treasurer to have allowed credit for all sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such to discharge him. Warrants or Orders. And the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be full and valid discharges to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for such sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.
