An Act to continue for three years an Act of the Governor with the advice of the Legislative Council passed in the eleventh year of His late Majesty intituled "An Act for abating "the Nuisance occasioned by the great number "of Dogs which are loose in the Streets of the "Towns of Sydney Parramatta Liverpool and "Windsor in the Colony of New South Wales." Council That the said Act shall be and the same is hereby continued for three years from and after the said thirty-first day of May one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.
