

HONEYSUCKLE POINT AND HENTY CEMETERIES ACT.

—
Act No. 3, 1916.

George V, An Act to provide for the removal of human
No. 3. remains and certain slabs and tombstones
from the cemeteries at Honeysuckle Point,
Newcastle, and from certain reserves for the
preservation of graves at Henty; for the
reinterment of such remains and the re-erec-
tion of such slabs and tombstones elsewhere;
and for purposes consequent thereon or inci-
dental thereto. [Assented to, 23rd March,
1916.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty,
by and with the advice and consent of the Legis-
lative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South
Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of
the same, as follows:—

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Honeysuckle Point
and Henty Cemeteries Act, 1916."

Removal of
certain
human
remains. **2.** The Secretary for Public Works may cause the
remains of all persons buried in the land at Newcastle
known as the Honeysuckle Point Cemeteries and in the
land at Henty known as reserves for the preservation of
graves, and respectively described in the First and
Second Schedules hereto (so far as such remains can by
reasonable diligence be discovered or identified), together
with all slabs and tombstones in relation thereto having
any legible inscription thereon, to be collected with due
care and removed respectively to the Sandgate Ceme-
tery at Newcastle and the General Cemetery at Henty,

or

or some other cemetery agreed upon with the representatives of the said persons so buried, and shall there cause such remains to be reinterred and such slabs or tombstones to be re-erected.

3. The cost of such removal, re-interment, and re-erection shall be defrayed from funds to be voted by Parliament for the purpose.

4. No compensation shall be payable by the said Secretary or the Government to any person in respect to the performance of any act authorised by this Act.

SCHEDULES.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece or parcel of land situate in the city of Newcastle, parish of Newcastle, county of Northumberland, and State of New South Wales, being the whole of the Presbyterian Cemetery and Roman Catholic Burial Ground at Honeysuckle Point : Commencing on the northern building line of Hunter-street, at the south-eastern corner of the said Roman Catholic Burial Ground ; and bounded thence on the east by the fenced western boundary of the Western Markets bearing northerly to the Great Northern railway fence ; thence on the north-east by that fence bearing north-westerly to the north-eastern corner of Storage Reserve No. 39,925 ; thence on the west and south-west by western and south-western fenced boundaries of the Presbyterian Cemetery aforesaid bearing southerly and south easterly to the aforesaid northern building line of Hunter-street ; and thence on the south by that building line bearing easterly to the point of commencement,—having an area of 1 acre 3 roods 29 perches or thereabouts.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

All those pieces or parcels of land situate in the village of Henty, parish of Henty, county of Hume, and State of New South Wales, being allotments 6, 15, and 16 of section 11, and allotments 5 and 11 of section 12 of the said village, having in all an area of 1 acre 0 roods 37 perches or thereabouts, notified in the Government Gazette, dated 7th September, 1901, by the Department of Lands as reserves from sale for the preservation of graves numbered respectively 33,253, 33,254, 33,255, 33,256, and 33,257.
