

JUDGES RETIREMENT (AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 22, 1919.

An Act to declare and amend the law relating to certain judges' pensions; to amend the Supreme Court and Circuit Courts Act, 1900, the Judges' Pensions Amendment Act, 1906, and the Judges Retirement Act, 1918; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Assented to, 5th December, 1919.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Judges Retirement (Amendment) Act, 1919." Short title.

2. (1) Section two of the Judges' Pensions Amendment Act, 1906, is amended by omitting the words appearing therein in inverted commas "appointed before the commencement of this Act" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "appointed before the commencement of the Judges' Pensions Amendment Act, 1906." Amendment of Judges' Pensions Amendment Act, 1906.

(2) The same section is amended by omitting the words "appointed after the commencement of this Act" where they occur in the new subsection two of the Supreme Court and Circuit Courts Act, 1900, inserted by that section, and inserting in lieu thereof the words "appointed after the commencement of the Judges' Pensions Amendment Act, 1906."

3. Section four of the Judges Retirement Act, 1918, paragraph (b), is amended by the addition of the following words at the end of the paragraph:—"and appointed before the commencement of the Judges' Pensions Amendment Act, 1906." Amendment of Judges Retirement Act, 1918.
