### An Act to repeal the prohibition on re-insurances of Marine Risks. [7th April, 1866.]

MARINE RISKS.

**W**HEREAS an Act of the Imperial Parliament was passed in the Preamble.  
nineteenth year of the reign of King George the Second inti-  
tuled "*An Act to regulate insurance on ships belonging to the subjects* 19 Geo. II cap. 37.  
*of Great Britain and on merchandises or effects laden thereon*" by  
section four whereof it is prohibited to make re-insurance except in Sec. 4.  
the cases therein mentioned And whereas it is expedient to remove  
such restriction Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most  
Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legis-  
lative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Par-  
liament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the said Act it shall Re-insurances of sea  
be lawful to make re-insurance upon any ship or vessel or upon any risks may lawfully  
goods merchandise or other property on board of any ship or vessel or be made.  
upon the freight of any ship or vessel or upon any other interest in or  
relating to any ship or vessel which may lawfully be insured.
