**An** Act to amend the Public Accountants Registration Act, 1945, as amended by subsequent Acts, in certain respects; to validate certain matters; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 31st May, 1951.]

**BE** it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

**1.** (1) This Act may be cited as the "Public Accountants Registration (Amendment) Act, 1951."

(2) The Public Accountants Registration Act, 1945, as amended by subsequent Acts and by this Act, may be cited as the Public Accountants Registration Act, 1945-1951.

**2.** (1) The Public Accountants Registration Act, 1945, as amended by subsequent Acts, is amended—

- (a) by omitting from paragraph (b) of subsection (1A) of section nineteen the words "one thousand nine hundred and fifty" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two";
- (b) (i) by omitting from subsection one of section twenty-three the word "October" and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "January";

- (ii) by omitting from the same subsection the words "the year commencing on the first day of January next following the prescribed day" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "the year commencing on that day";
- (iii) by omitting from subsection three of the same section the word "November" wherever occurring and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "February."

(2) The amendment made by paragraph (a) of subsection one of this section shall be deemed to have commenced on the twenty-eighth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five.
