POLICE REGULATION (AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 20, 1944.

An Act to provide for extended leave of absence George VI. for members of the police force and the payment of the monetary value of any such extended leave not taken before death; for these purposes to amend the Police Regulation Act, 1899-1943; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 14th November, 1944.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- (2) The Police Regulation Act, 1899, as amended by subsequent Acts, and by this Act, may be cited as the Police Regulation Act, 1899-1944.
- 2. The Police Regulation Act, 1899-1943, is amended Amendment by inserting next after section twelve the following new of Act No. 20, 1899. sections:

12A. Every member of the police force who has had fifteen years service shall be entitled to three months absence leave on full pay or six months on half pay, and on after years of service. the completion of twenty years service shall be Act No. 43, entitled to a further three months leave on full pay 1919, s. 13. or six months on half pay. After completion of further service after twenty years and up to a total service of forty years in all, he shall be entitled to a further proportionate amount of leave on full pay or half pay calculated on the basis of six months or twelve months respectively for twenty years service.

Dependent relative to receive money value of feave not taken or completed. Act No. 43, 1919, s. 14. 12B. Where a member of the police force has acquired a right under this Act to extended leave with pay and dies before entering upon it, or after entering upon it dies before its termination, his widow, or in the case of a widower leaving children, his children, or their guardian, or other dependent relative, or their legal representative, shall be entitled to receive the money value of the leave not taken, or not completed, computed at the rate of salary the member of the police force received at the time of his death. Such payment shall be in addition to any payment due under the provisions of the Police Regulation (Superannuation) Act, 1906-1944:

Provided that where payment of the money value of leave has been made under this section, no action may be brought against the Crown for payment of any amount in respect of such leave.
